CASH FOR CONTAINERS. . .

Malvern Springs Primary School has partnered with Scouts WA to participate in the Cash for Containers recycling scheme. The benefits of this scheme include reducing the amount of rubbish going to landfill, encourage recycling behaviours from our students and families and raise funds for the purchase and installation of Solar panels around our school. Families are able to contribute to this project in three ways;

- 1. Deposit eligible containers into the school recycling bin directly. The recycling bin is located behind the canteen.
- 2. Hand in eligible containers to Mr Collopy in the Science room.
- 3. Take eligible containers to any recycling centre and quote the school's Scheme ID number (C10324113) so that proceeds are donated directly to the school.

CASH FOR CONTAINERS UPDATE...
